Brief history of the school:

Tibetan Homes Foundation (THF) is a registered charitable institute dedicated to working for the care of orphan, semi-orphan and destitute Tibetan refugee children. More than five decades have gone by since its small beginning in November 1962 at Mussoorie by His Holiness Tenzin Gyatso the XIVth Dalai Lama. Tibetan Homes Foundation has been taking care of Tibetan refugee children in exile and senior citizens under its old age homes. The institute as a whole tries to work effectively with its mission to care for the Tibetan refugee children in exile under its care, to provide with the best possible means of good education so that these children grow up as self reliant and contributing members of community at large, to impart and inculcate the rich traditions, moral values and cultural heritage of Tibet to preserve and promote our Tibetan identity that faces great danger of being wiped out, to provide a good care needed for senior citizens who are left on their own at the evening of their life, and to render other social services in the form of “Outreach Community Program.

Problem statement (Why we need this project?):

The region has a poor electricity supply because of which we are left without electricity from 8 to 10 hours daily especially during the rainy season. It becomes very difficult for the children to perform minor task especially when they need to complete their class presentations. The power cut off is one of the consistent problems here in our location and the authorities tried to deal with it many times with new connections to few homes, line alterations and phase change in few homes also. The problems still persist with children’s facing difficulty especially during the academic terminal examinations and group presentation in regard to their syllabus. Recently, wild animal were seen by few staff during the dusk when there was a power cut off. This may invite harms to children if in case, they come across the animal when there is no light. A need for the installation of lamp post on the way and outside the homes were also felt necessary to avoid accidental cases which may arise from the seen wild animal. We have reached for grant support for the establishment of lamp post outside the children’s home for safety reasons to two of our supporting agencies and awaiting their reply.

Specific Objectives:

- ✓ To ease the power cut problems in 21 – family homes, temple, Dispensary and guest house.
- ✓ To provide children homes with power back up facilities.
- ✓ Children’s will be able to perform their academic assessments without power interruptions.

Expected Outcome:

- 1) Provision of power back up for 6 hours daily in time of electricity failure.
- 2) Children can work on their assessment and presentation works.
- 3) Children can study without power interruptions in time of terminal examinations.
- 4) Home parents can provide meals on time (dinner).
- 5) Emergencies can be dealt on time without electricity interruptions.
- 6) Ailing children in dispensary will benefit.

Beneficiaries:

A total number of 532 – **Children** living in a number of 21 – larger and smaller family homes will benefit from the project implementation. The remaining children homes, school temple, school dispensary and guest house will benefit from the project implementation.
