PART B : PROJECT CONTEXT

Introduction:

Tibetan Homes Foundation (THF) is a registered charitable institute dedicated to working for the care of orphan, semi-orphan and destitute Tibetan refugee children. More than five decades have gone by since its small beginning in November 1962 at Mussoorie by His Holiness Tenzin Gyatso the XIVth Dalai Lama. Tibetan Homes Foundation has been taking care of Tibetan refugee children in exile and senior citizens under its old age homes. The institute as a whole tries to work effectively with its mission to care for the Tibetan refugee children in exile under its care, to provide with the best possible means of good education so that these children grow up as self reliant and contributing members of community at large, to impart and inculcate the rich traditions, moral values and cultural heritage of Tibet to preserve and promote our Tibetan identity that faces great danger of being wiped out, to provide a good care needed for senior citizens who are left on their own at the evening of their life, and to render other social services in the form of "Outreach Community Program

Project Summary:

The school has a small clinic with a capacity of 50 inpatients with a residence doctor and a team of health workers and nurses to take care of children. The beds in the clinic were the one in-use since 20 years back. Most of the beds were repaired many times to continue the use as far as possible. Since all the in-patients were our children, we consider it our priority to replace all the beds depending on the fund support. The project is to implement first in Tibetan Homes Foundation, Mussoorie and then in Rajpur branch school.

Why the project need?

An observation and monitoring of children is necessary when they were sick especially when the disease is in related to food infection. The present beds in the clinic were of height where small children can't reach easily and are also not comfortable to sleep. There is also risk of small child falling down from the bed as the present beds were normal beds as used in our houses.

Beneficiaries

The direct beneficiaries were all the children, Senior citizens and staff who lives in Tibetan Homes Foundation, Mussoorie, branch school Rajpur and Gohri Mafi. . The age group of 6 to 90 years of children and elderly people will benefit from the project.
