**PART B: PROJECT CONTEXT**

**B.1. Introduction:**

Tibetan Homes Foundation (THF) is a registered charitable institute dedicated to working for the care of orphan, semi-orphan and destitute Tibetan refugee children. More than five decades have gone by since its small beginning in November 1962 at Mussoorie by His Holiness Tenzin Gyatso the XIV<sup>th</sup> Dalai Lama. Tibetan Homes Foundation has been taking care of Tibetan refugee children in exile and senior citizens under its old age homes. The institute as a whole tries to work effectively with its mission to care for the Tibetan refugee children in exile under its care, to provide with the best possible means of good education so that these children grow up as self reliant and contributing members of community at large, to impart and inculcate the rich traditions, moral values and cultural heritage of Tibet to preserve and promote our Tibetan identity that faces great danger of being wiped out, to provide a good care needed for senior citizens who are left on their own at the evening of their life, and to render other social services in the form of “Outreach Community Program.

**B.2. Problem statement :**

The present sanitation is inviting diseases with the improper dormant flushing where children used to fetch water from outside the flush the waste and there is no proper drainage in the bathroom area. The building was club of two children homes – Home number 3 and 13 where the sanitation corner is dark with no sufficient light from outside. There is also no separate toilet for gender base and the poor sanitation area in this particular home accommodation around 51 children and staff is leading the health issues. A proper development in the sanitation area is also important for a pastoral care and development of a child.

**B.3. Objectives:**

The major renovation of the sanitation area with the extension of the project area. A separate gender based toilet and bathroom with the installation of urinal, cistern and ventilation will be provided to the children for a hygienic development.
