PART B : PROJECT CONTEXT

School Background:

Tibetan Homes Foundation Rajpur branch school was established in the year 1999 as primary school. The school was gradually upgraded and at present, the branch school is higher secondary school affiliated with CBSE . The school has 22 classrooms including two ICT labs where all children have regular classes. Students from primary to higher secondary are benefiting from the technology classes with one computer basic trainer and one advanced trainer. Two teachers looked after the lab and the students attending the classes. The enrichment of the classes becomes very important with the provision of back ups, proper sitting arrangements and learning programs which keeps motivating students for more participation.

Introduction

Tibetan Homes Foundation (THF) is a registered charitable institution dedicated to working for care of orphans, semi-orphans, destitute Tibetan refugee children and needed elders. THF was established in the year 1962 as a home for orphans, semi-orphans and destitute Tibetan refugee children inspired by the far sighted vision of His Holiness the XIVth Dalai Lama. THF works ceaselessly towards providing Tibetan children under its fold a homely care and decent education along creating positive environment and facilities for sustaining the unique Tibetan identity. THF also takes care of its retired employees and maintains two homes for needy elders. THF also renders social service supports through it's "Out reach community program".

Objectives (why the Project)?

The present furniture in the lab was insufficient for all students and moreover, the replacement is also necessary with many chairs broken and repaired few times. The project aims to motivate students to keep their interest moving in this digital world where technology plays prime role in everyday life. The project also aims to inculcate our small kids with cultural values by providing cultural costumes of their size. The present costumes used by the children were oversized and very old.

Beneficiaries

The direct beneficiaries were all the students and small kids taking at the initial stage of their learning in the Montessori section. A total of 345 children will benefit from the project implementation.
