**Introduction:**

Tibetan Homes Foundation (THF) is a registered charitable institute dedicated to working for the care of orphan, semi-orphan and destitute Tibetan refugee children. More than five decades have gone by since its small beginning in November 1962 at Mussoorie by His Holiness Tenzin Gyatso the XIVth Dalai Lama. Tibetan Homes Foundation has been taking care of Tibetan refugee children in exile and senior citizens under its old age homes. The institute as a whole tries to work effectively with its mission to care for the Tibetan refugee children in exile under its care, to provide with the best possible means of good education so that these children grow up as self reliant and contributing members of community at large, to impart and inculcate the rich traditions, moral values and cultural heritage of Tibet to preserve and promote our Tibetan identity that faces great danger of being wiped out, to provide a good care needed for senior citizens who are left on their own at the evening of their life, and to render other social services in the form of "Outreach Community Program.

**Needs / Problem statement:**

- ✓ No separate toilet for gender.
- ✓ No proper urinal and drainage in the bathroom.
- ✓ No cistern in the toilet.
- ✓ Poor or no ventilation to pass air.
- ✓ Flushing facility in the present toilet is in dormant stage with the children manually fetching water from the storage in the bathroom to flush the waste.
- ✓ Poor sanitation in the family home accommodating average of 54 member in each family home is leading the health issues.

**Goal / Objectives:**

- ✓ Major reparation of the toilet and bathroom.
- ✓ Extension of the project area for separate use of gender.
- ✓ Installation of cistern in each toilet area.
- ✓ Establishment of ventilation from the dismantling of the existing possible area.
- ✓ Proper water flush out area with installation of urinal, in case needed.

**Procedures / Scope of work:**

The project will be implemented earliest after receiving the fund approval. Estate section headed by and under the management of General Secretary will proceed with these family home reparation projects.

**Conclusion:**

Tibetan Homes Foundation will remain thankful for the fund support towards the "Family home toilet reparation" proposal. The project implementation will be a benefit to all the children and staff living in the particular family home minimising health issues.
